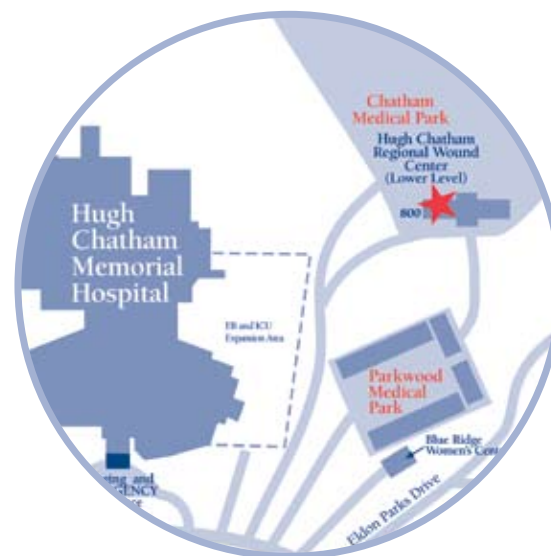

Follow These Guidelines for Your Best Care

- Keep each appointment with your physician and clinician.
- Change your dressings as you learned from your visit.
- Call a wound treatment member if you have concerns about your wound.
- Feel free to ask questions at all times!

What You Can Expect When You Call and Visit

Prepare for Your First Visit

- Make an appointment by calling (336) 527-1033.
- Give us the name of your referring physician. Your referring physician will continue to oversee your medical care. We'll give him or her regular updates on your wound treatments.
- Bring your list of allergies, medicine, herbal supplements and other over-the-counter products you are taking.
- Bring past medical records, insurance cards and forms for your first visit.
- Remember that Hugh Chatham Regional Wound Center accepts Medicare, Medicaid and many insurance plans.
- Bring your insurance cards with you for each visit.

Your first visit will take about an hour. If you are diabetic, please bring a snack and any medication you may need to take during your visit.

Together, We'll Develop Your Own Plan of Care

Our clinical team of physicians, clinicians and other specialists will work closely with you to:

- Review your medical history, blood work and specialized tests
- Complete your physical assessment
- Assess, measure and document your wound
- Document additional information needed to formulate your individual plan of care
- Develop an individualized treatment plan for your wound.
